Anne Frank (1929-1945) was a young Jewish girl who lived in the Netherlands during World War II. Anne was an outgoing and spirited child. She got into more trouble than her quiet and serious older sister. Anne liked to read and dreamed of being a writer someday. Growing up she had lots of friends. Her family was Jewish and followed some of the Jewish holidays and customs, because of this, she and her family were victims of the Holocaust. Anne kept a diary chronicling her time hiding from the Nazis and in the concentration camp. Her first-hand accounts revealed both the atrocities of war and the power of the human spirit. After her death, at the age of fifteen, her father found and published Anne's diary in a book called the Diary of a Young Girl, which is now considered a literary classic.
