C.S. Lewis (1898-1963) was a novelist, poet, literary critic, essayist, and theologian. Born in Belfast, Ireland, he was influenced by Irish, Greek, and Norse mythology, and additionally by W.B. Yeats and the Celtic Revival Movement. Lewis's fascination lied with fairy tales, myths, and ancient legends. While writing, he incorporated these mythical creatures along with his own memories—such as that of the old wardrobe from his childhood. He is best known for his fictional work, *The Chronicles of Narnia, The Screwtape Letters* and *The Space Trilogy*. He served on the English faculty at Oxford University and was also a close friend of fellow novelist J.R.R. Tolkien.
